### FLOOD PREVENTION POSSIBLE ACCORDING TO S. I. N. U. STUDENT

Surgin and irresistible flood waters have inundated and destroyed the first attempt in large areas of the western states. Government relief agencies have done as much as possible to relieve the situation.

Army engineers assert that this flood could have been prevented. Future floods on the Ohio, Mississippi, and tributary rivers can and must be avoided.

**CAUSES AND SOLUTIONS**  
Naturally the primary cause of the flood, was the unusually heavy rainfall in the river areas, which, according to the United States Weather Bureau, was the result of warm moisture-laden air from the Gulf meeting cold air of northern origin, causing the warm air to rise, become chilled, condense and fall in the form of rain, snow, and sleet.

The most important cause of floods, however, is not the amount of rain control. It is impossible to dispense of flood waters in such a way that river banks will not be threatened.

Another factor causing floods, many believe, is the large number of government dams which keep the river banks from being washed away.

This serious biography of America's first political boss, CHARLES PENROSE, Symbol of an Era, by Dr. R. D. Bowen, Head of the Sociology Department, has drawn a full length portrait of an intellectual and physical giant who also became a political giant.
