



· 64 NEED NEW TRAINING SCHOOLS TO SERVE AS MODELS

Even as the college proper needs more building space and equipment, so also do the S. I. N. U. preparatory schools merit better housing in which to continue their work. Conducted by the college, the elementary and high schools on the campus should serve as model institutions for all southern Illinois schools. The university grammar and secondary schools should be the center of educational activity in southern Illinois; they should set the examples for modern progressive schools and should pioneer in raising educational standards.

Unfortunately, the training and high schools, handicapped by lack of space accomodations, now rank below several city, schools in the vicinity. Lack of sufficient funds has hindered the college in its attempts to modernize its preparatory schools.

The construction of a new training school would not only benefit the school children but would also improve the college by providing more space on the campus. A new building should be creeted on a large plot of land situated closer to the business district. Located nearer the center of Carbondale, the school could serve more of the children of the city. Provided with large playgrounds equipped with modern recreational facilities, the school would furnish a safe place for play.

The space created by the removal of the training school from the campus could readily be utilized by the college to provide offices for faculty members, additional classroom space, for social activities, or to contribute ground for the erection of a cafeteria and dormitories. With the training school situated a calcteria and dormitories. With the training school situated away from the campus, the college, envelopped in a more studious atmosphere, could partially itealize the program of expansion which it anticipates and which is so greatly needed.
