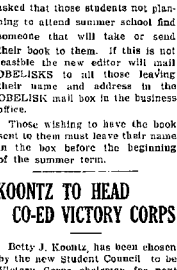

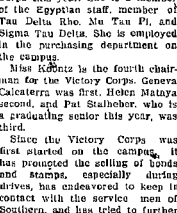

### LAY SPEAKS TO LIONS CLUB

Dr. Chester F. Lay addressed the Lions Club at their regular meeting last Friday afternoon, May 25, in the Roberts Hotel.

President Lay discussed some of the future possibilities of Southern in view of its expansion program.

He expressed a particular interest in training future leaders in the business and commercial field in Southern Illinois in addition to its traditional function of training teachers.

Dr. Lay also reported on the progress of the legislative program. Approximately a 40 percent increase in regular appropriations has already been passed into its final stages, and in addition, nearly \$5,000,000 for a building program has been approved by the post-war planning commission.

Lay.
