NEGRO LIFE TO BE STUDIED AT NEXT DUNBAR MEETING

A study will be made of the various phases of negro life and work at the regular meetings of the Dunbar Society during the rest of the term. Various members of the society will discuss such topics as negro poets, negro novelists and writers, folk plays of the colored race, and negro music.

Mr. J. E. Penn, graduate of Wilberforce University at Wilberforce, Ohio, and principal of the Carbonate Atchuck High School, spoke to the society at the meeting on April 25. His topic was, "What the Prospective Teacher Should Be Prepared to Meet in Obtaining and Holding a Position."

Mr. Penn stressed the fact that the beginning teacher must be able to adjust himself, to utilize the time and equipment that he has to the best advantage. "For," said Mr. Penn, "you won't find your schools equipped and run like the model training school here when you go out to teach."

He also told the prospective teachers to develop an independent attitude, be able to talk for themselves and show their worth when they go out after a job.

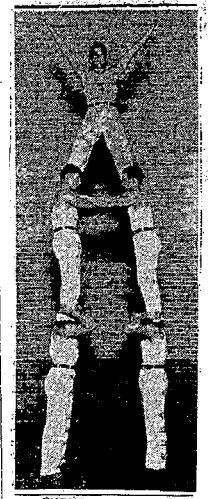
