# BUREAU MAN SPEAKS AT AGRICULTURAL CLUB

Mr. A. F. Lentz from the Harris-Lurg Farm Bureau talked to the Agriculture club last Thursday night on "Short Time Farm Loans". A short history of the cooperative short history of the cooperative farm loans was reviewed up to the present year. Seventy-five years ago in Garmany and Sweden these loan in Germany and Sweden these loan plans worked successfully. In the state of Illinois there are approximately the state of Illinois there are approximately twenty short time loan offices. The Harrisburg office serves, the section of the state. Loans are under for twelve months of less on summer splows as \$50 and as high as \$25,000 at a 5 percent interest rate. These offices are backed by the government and are entirely reliable.
