GREAT ART WORK OF ENTIRE COMMUNITY, NOT SINGLE PERSON

Great art is not the work of a single person, but the combined work of an entire community. That statement should be realized especially in this community of Carbondale which is typical of so many small mid-western towns. Southern Illinois has had many other examples where an artist-has had to leave his small community in search of a place where he could combine his work with that of the community, but in Carbondale it should be realized if in no other place.

In 1900 Southern Illinois lost George O. "Pop" Hart, born in Cairo, Illinois, in 1868. He followed nomadic impulses in search of a place to study art. Leaving Cairo, he traveled the seven seas returning to America to become one of the greatest colorist ever to live. The community to recognize this young man was not in Southern Illinois, but in the metropolitan areas. In 1940, Penny Cent left Harrisburg because the criticism of certain civic organizations was unfavorable toward a man born and educated in Germany. Few realized that this man was at that time Head of Federal Art time Project in Southern Illinois, and that this man could have done for Harrisburg what Bohrod did for Chicago-turn dirt, smoke, and shacks into beauty. Again, another com-munity will recognize the potential abilities of a man who had already won a Guggenheim fellowship. In Carbondale we have lost not only a great artist, but have lost for this community the name of Burnett H. Shryock. In years before community the name of Burnett H. Shryock, in years before Shryock had worked in Carbondale with the community to produce great art. Favorable criticism was on the front pages of many leading periodicals. We must re-alize the loss. Another community will be fortunate. These are only a few of the many examples which are to be found throughout this mid-western area.

Artists work through the inspiration of their own environment and only when the peoples of that social, economic, or political environment realize, understand, and appreciate the goal of the artist can he succeed in producing great art for himself and that community.

The trend of modern art is not art for art sake but the accomplishment of an art that will serve the community and an art in which form follows function. The function of art in Southern Illinois is not limited and the form in which that art will serve this area is also not limited. Any phase of postwar planning will need the assistance of architects, artists and designers. On this campus the need will no doubt some-day be realized. We are planning now fort he day when this university will expand into a great University. Of what use is an art department in this goal? None, if we let the political architects come down here and build our new cam-pus. The actual construction planning should be a longterm project which no doubt it is. We need buildings on this campus typical of the era in which they were built, To copy the Georgian style from the University of Illinois will mean nothing. To have a bell tower when we have electric bells is a waste of money and materials. The building project is but one example of the need for a great art de

Our president is new. No doubt he will see for himself the great need at this university for a strong art department. A department that will serve all southern Illinois. We had the beginning of such a department, a department which was serving the community in many ways.
