Yesterday, we were informed that a movement is on in the State legislature to slash \$300,000 from the 1945-47 bigunial budget of the five Teachers' Colleges: Eastern Diemnial budget of the five Teachers, Colleges: Eastern Diminis State Teachers, Western Illinois State Teachers, Northern Illinois State Teachers, Western Illinois State Teachers, and Southern. The 1945-47 budget, which was submitted and approved by the Teachers' College Board to the State Budgetary Commission called for 8074-552.00 in general revenue, of which Southern was to get \$1.831,748.00. This is an increase of 40° over the 1943-35 biennial budget which allowed \$1,303,014 for Southern's general revenue, fluid. Between the last biennial budget and the proposed budget, the status of Southern has changed. In addition to offering Teacher training, we also have a Liberal Arts School and Vocational School. These programs in order to expand sufficiently must have adequate funds, honce the reason for the S528,734.00 increase over the 43-45 budget. A summary of the anglor increases reveal that a 40.6° increase or \$306,990.00 in personal services has been recommended. During the forthcoming week which has been designated as Brotherhood Week, it is especially fitting that we take stock of our beliefs about other peoples in the United States as well as the world. If we believe in democracy, we cannot turn away from the inequalities which exist for that is no solution. That some solution must be reached is essential to the problem as it relates to minorities whether they be Japanese, Jewish, or Negro.

The Negroes in the United States are the largest racial minority in the United States. That they suffer from in-dignities and inequalities is evidenced in signs like these; White Only, or "We reserve the right to sent our customeñs".

"Institutional segregation", that is, exclusion from white schools, libraries, parks, playgrounds, railroad cars, hotels, restaurants, have long been practiced by southern states and border states, of which Illinois can be listed, unfortunately.

The problem of segregation in housing is today one of America's major problems, for the Negroes must live within restricted areas which result in overcrowding. This policy of segregation is expensive to both the taxpayer and racial harmony. An interesting fact was brought out recently by the National Urban League which found that residential segregation is relatively new in America, having been scarcely known before 1910. In Baltimore, Negroes who constitute 20% of the population, are crammed into 2% of the residential area.

Segregation exists in employment. Gunner Myrdal writing on the Negro problem found that in Miami, Fla., it has been impossible to use Negroes in skilled or semi-skilled


