Comment [5]: My aim here has been to write a history of this auditory landscape, to describe it in all its magnificence, and then to retrace the process by which it disintegrated. This disintegration, contrary to what one might expect, was not linked to any drop in the size of peals.... It was rather that their meaning seemed to fall away, modes of attention collapsed, the usages and rhetoric of the bells grew narrower so that, in short, a whole range of auditory messages were increasingly disqualified. He was Chairman of the Board of Alderman of Boston in 1853."


