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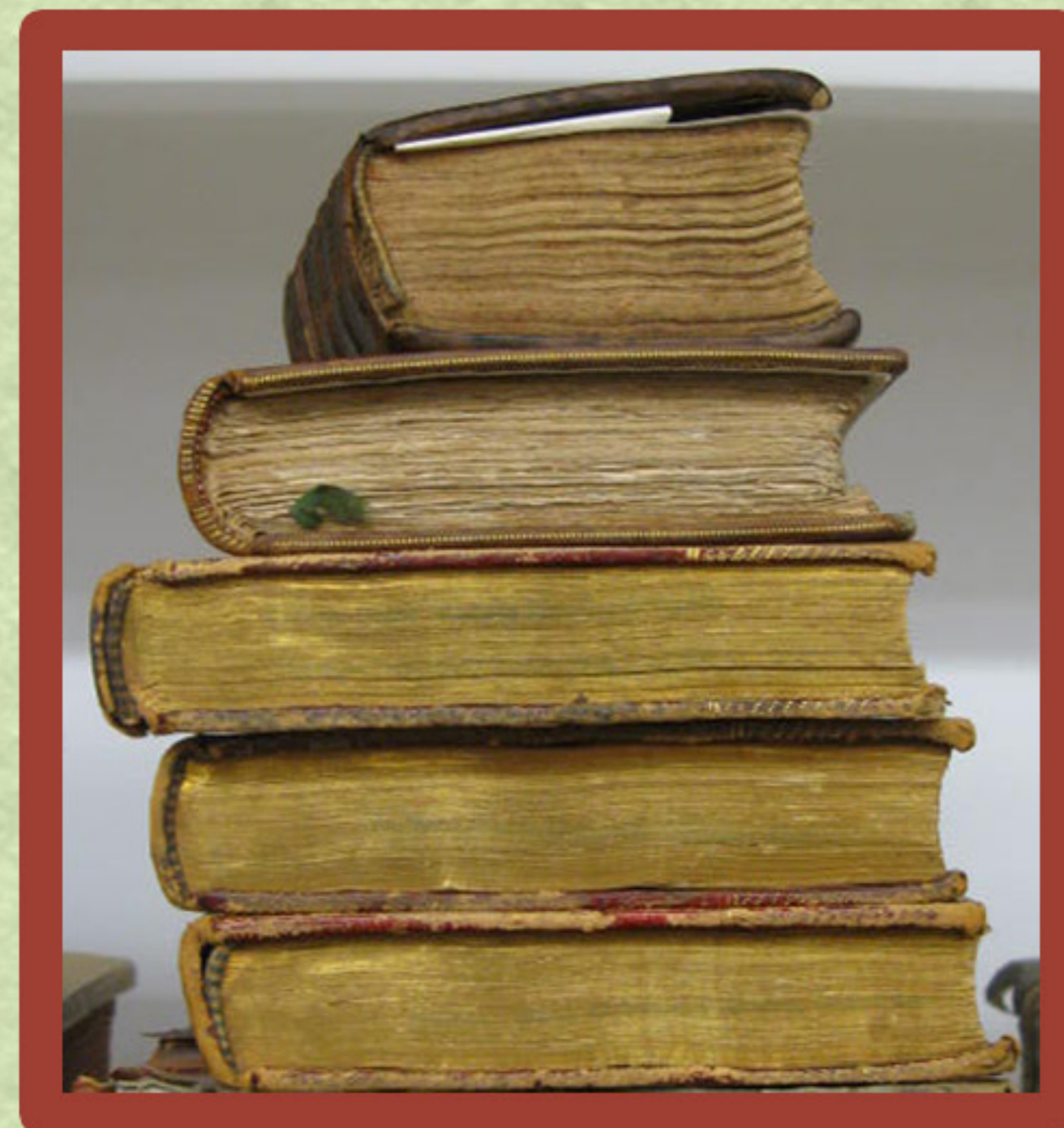
Acquiring from Secondary/Used Sources: Money Saver or Time Sink

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GOALS

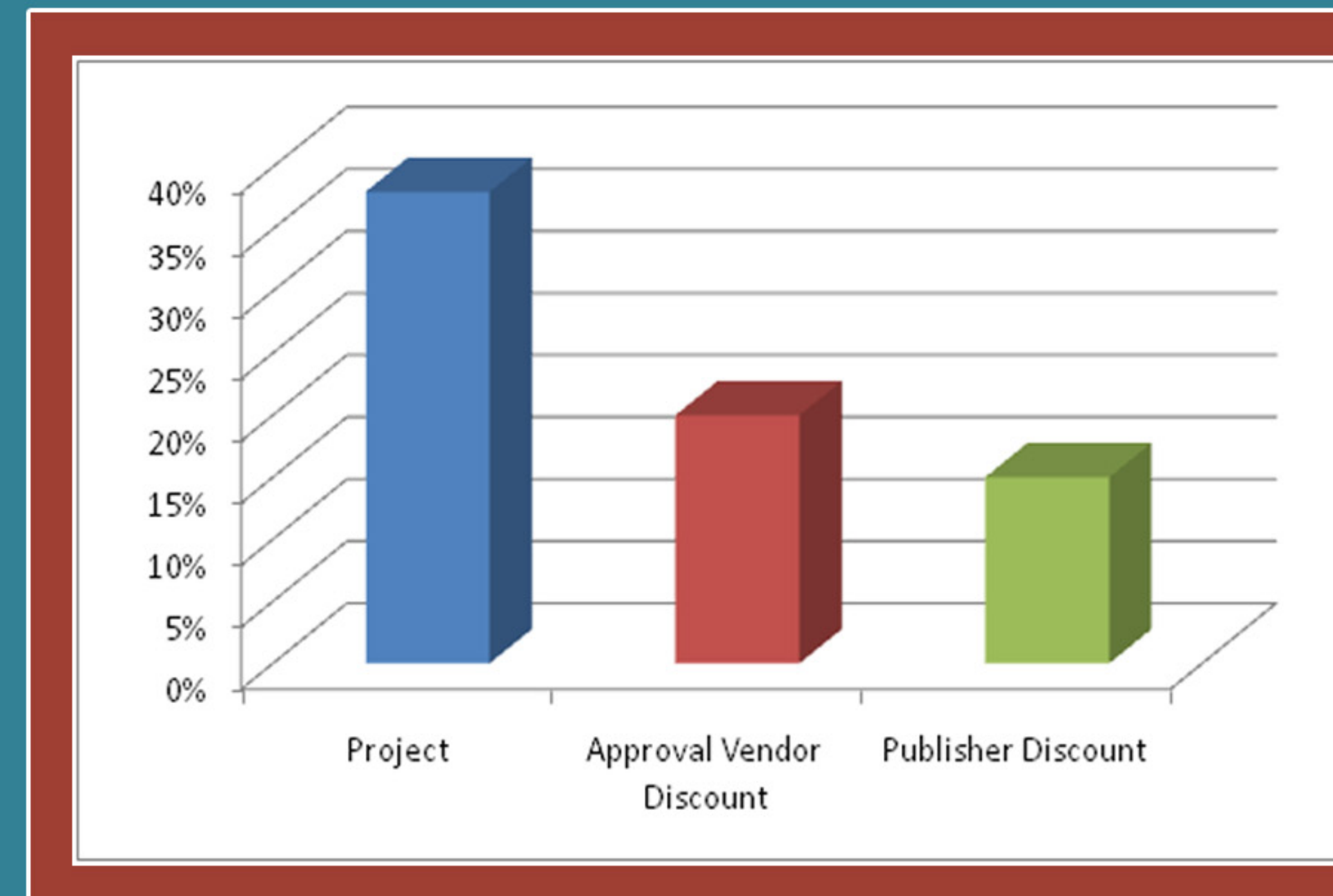
To determine whether buying from used or secondary sources would in fact:

- (1) save the library money
- (2) incur any extra burden on the Preservation Unit due to the used conditions

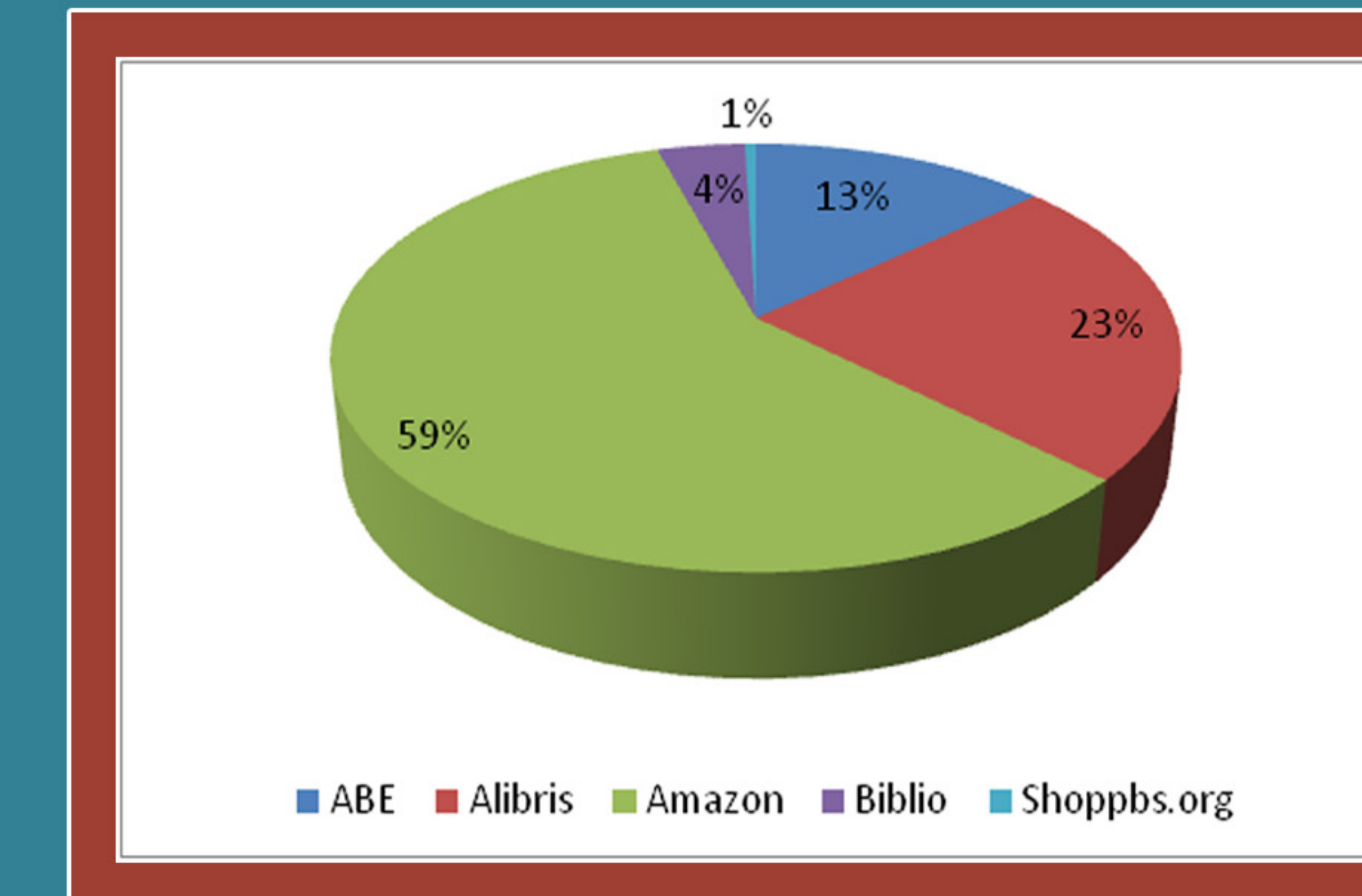


RESULTS

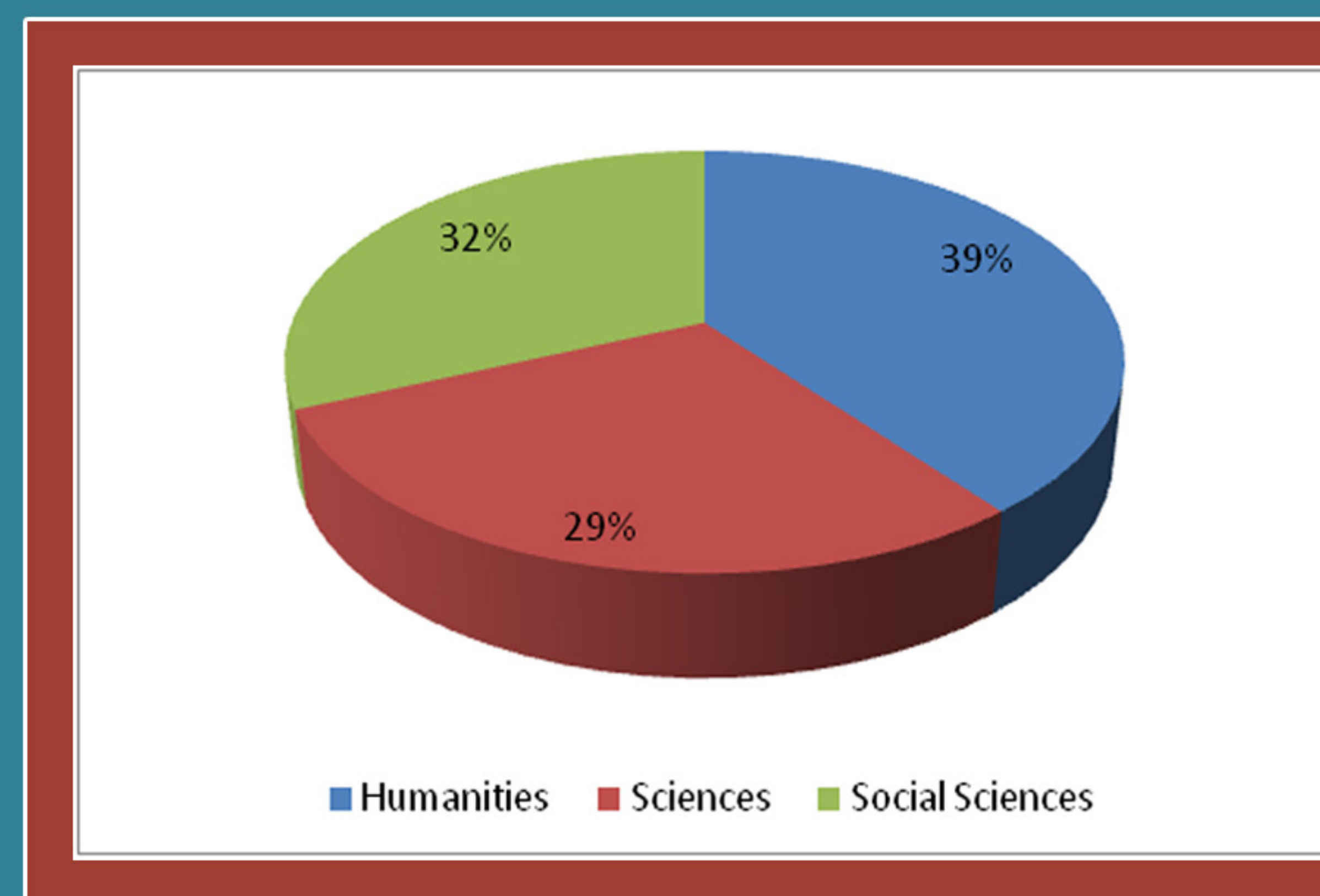
- The average percentage saved per item is significantly higher than through direct sources.
- Two out of two-hundred orders (1%) needed direct Preservation work when they were received by Acquisitions.
- Twelve out of two hundred items (6%) needed Preservation's recommendation on quality before the items were purchased.
- Sixteen out of two hundred (8%) orders were cancelled by the vendor and had to be re-ordered from other sources.



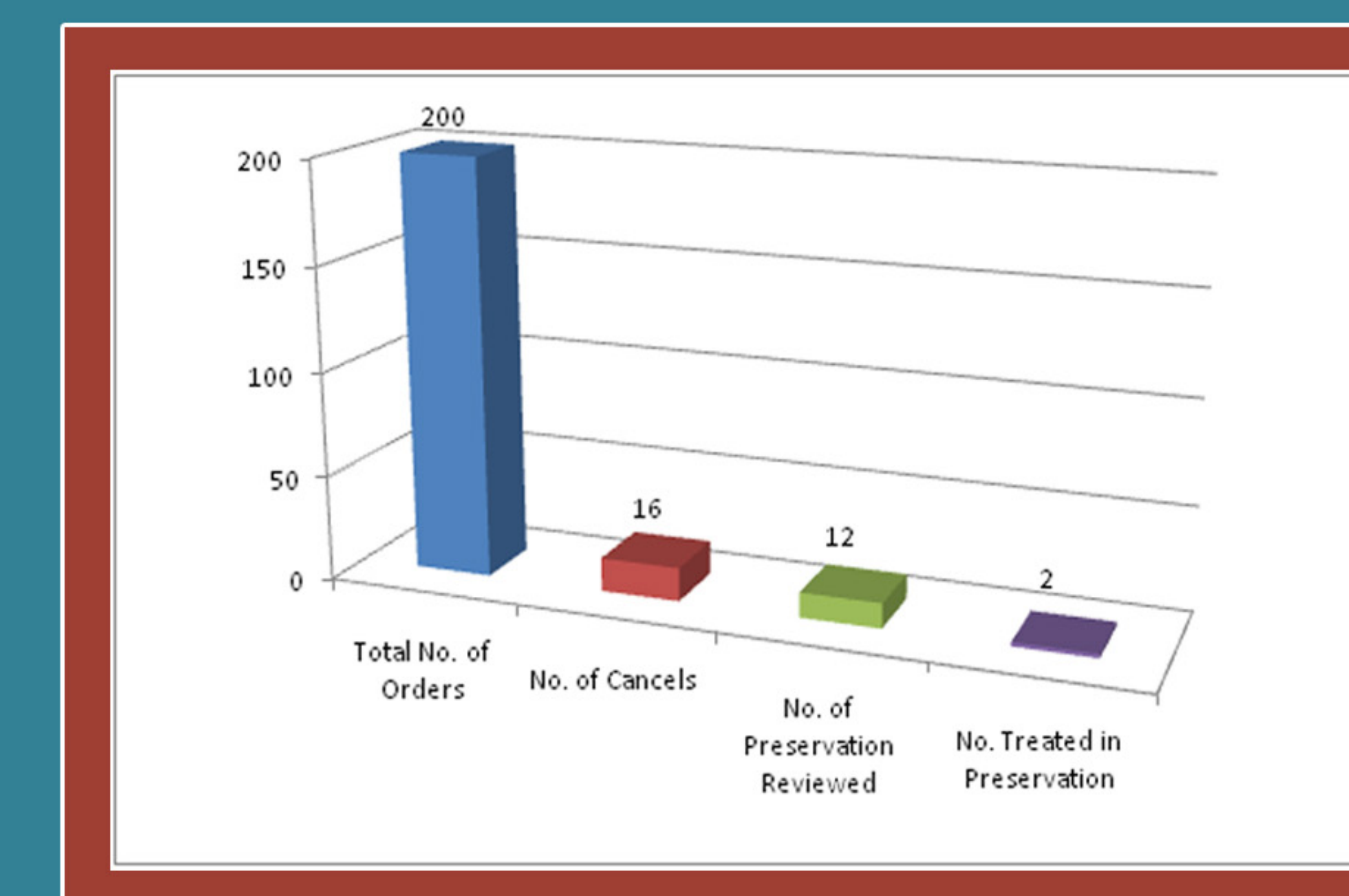
SAVINGS

PERCENTAGE BY ORDERS



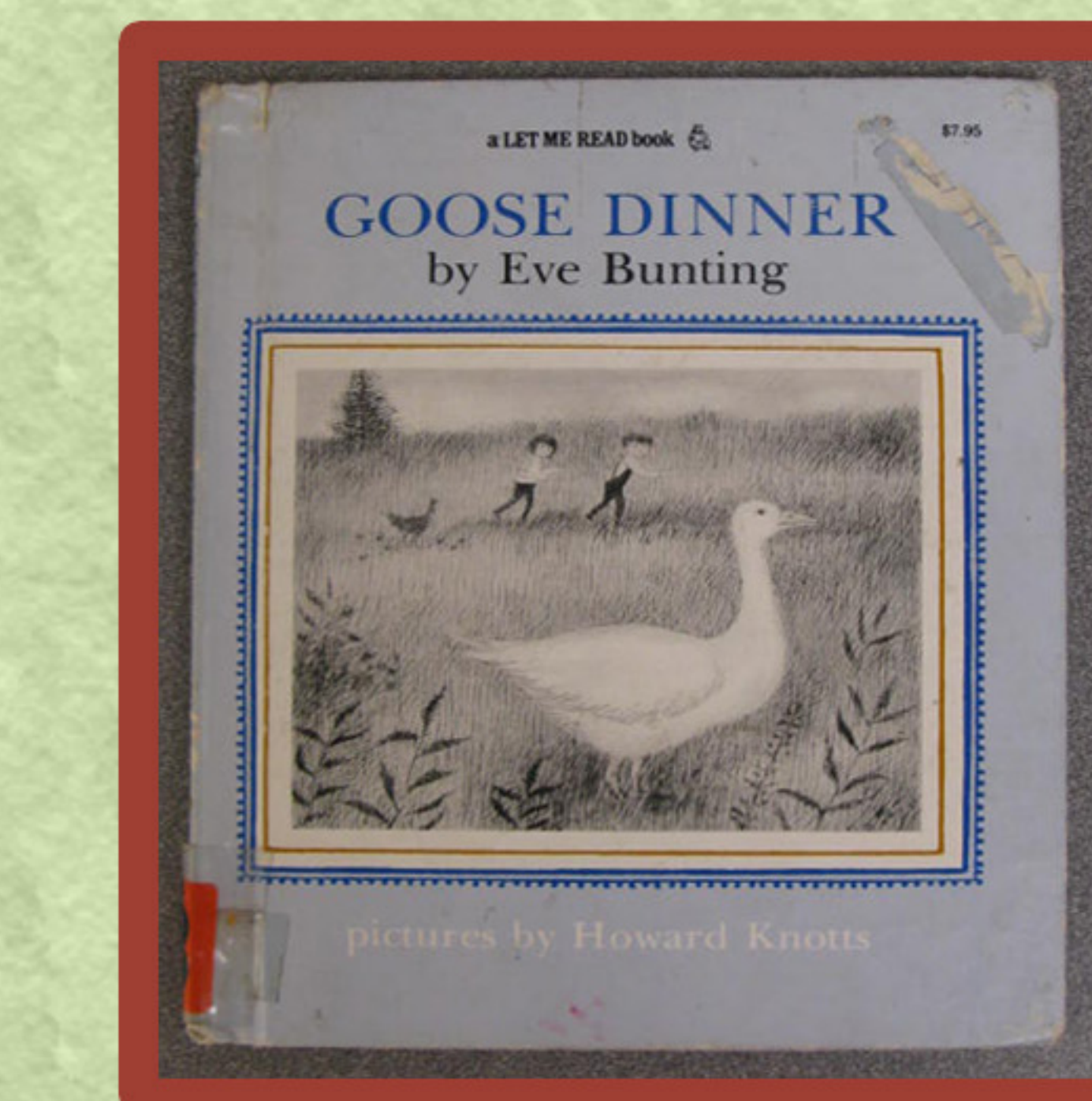

METHODOLOGY

- Took a sampling of firm orders placed by the Collection Development Librarians and under certain parameters with condition and seller rating, purchased items from used/secondary sources.
- Reviewed literature to compare documentation of any similar projects.
- Reviewed and analyzed data to make determination whether secondary markets are a viable source of savings and efficiency.



CONCLUSIONS

- Purchasing items through secondary sources can save a library more money than ordering through direct vendors, particularly when ordering older materials that are still in print.
- Purchasing new and used items through secondary sources does not put an added extra burden on Preservation.
- Time and efficiency can be factors in determining whether purchasing from secondary sources is a viable option for your library.
