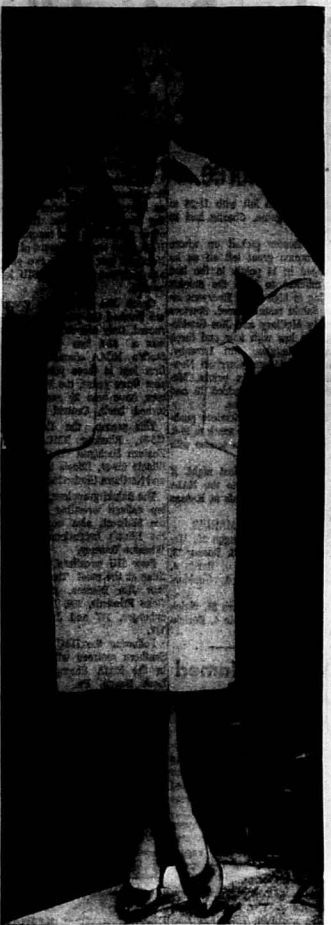
**ALPHA PHI ALPHA PLEDGE DANCE**
