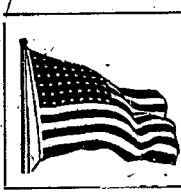

Typical fields of employment for which the university offers training are: General Fanning, Industrial Chemistry, Teaching, Typing, Stenography, Secretarial Work, Court Report Writing, Accounting, Educational Office Management, Professional Art Advertising, Art, Dressmaking, Weaving, Translating, Dressmaking, Cooking, Dietetics, Interior Decorating, Mechanical Drafting, Statistical Work, Music, Training for Industrial Training, Hospital Dietetics, Training for Doctors' assistants, hospital internships, pharmacy aids, and laboratory technicians in bacteriology, general medicine, positions which require training in following fields: chemistry, hydroponics, agriculture, physics, meteorology, mathematics, and professional work in dentistry, radio-phonics, law and medicine.

The Moscové Declaration Three-Power Agreement

We, the President of the United States of America, the Prime Minister of Great Britain, and the Premier of the Soviet Union, have met in these four days past in this capital of our ally, Moscové, and have shaped and confirmed our common policy.

We express our determination that our nations shall work together in the war and in the peace that will follow. As to the war, our military staffs have joined in our round-table discussions and we have conceived our plans for the destruction of the German forces...

With our diplomatic advisers we have surveyed the problems of the future. We shall seek the cooperation and active participation of all nations, large and small, whose hearts in heart and in mind are dedicated, as are our own peoples, to the elimination of tyranny and slavery, oppression and intolerance...

Emerging from these friendly conferences we look with confidence to the day when all the peoples of the world may live free lives untroubled by tyranny and according to their varying needs and their own consciences.

AMERICANS UNINFORMED CONCERNING JAPAN

In dealing effectively with nations in the post-war era, it is imperative that we have an understanding of that nations' problems, whether ally or enemy.

Fortune magazine recently conducted a poll of thousands of Americans and found an appalling lack of information on Japan. The people interviewed were asked whether the population of Japan was near 50 million, 75 million, 90 million, 110 million or 125 million.

Very few people know that the governmental system of Japan has an outward form which is similar to the governmental system of the Western world. The Japanese constitution was based on the Prussian model.

Today, after two and half years of war, Japan has acquired one of the richest areas in the world—Netherlands East Indies. In this region 90 per cent of the world's rubber supply and 65 per cent of tin resources can be found.
