Coach Glenn "Abe" Martin and his Maroon cagers made their visit to Normal and Bloomington last Friday and Saturday a successful weekend as they rolled up two victories over Old Normal (43-27), and Illinois Wesleyan (50-41).

GROUPS JOIN S.I.N.U. FOR FARM SHOW IN OLD SCIENCE

A Farm and Home Labor Saving Show will be held in the Old Science building on the campus of Southern Illinois Normal University on Friday morning and afternoon of this week, and the public is invited to attend. The show is a series of 24 exhibits held in various Illinois counties, but it is the only one being offered in this immediate area.

Cooperating in sponsoring the show are the Southern Illinois Normal University, County Farm and Home Advertisers, the Illinois Farmers' Institute and the Extension Service of the University of Illinois College of Agriculture. The Extension Service is sending a truckload of labor-saving equipment and displays to supplement local exhibits.

Farmers who have developed labor-saving devices and equipment are being encouraged to bring them to the show. The devices should be taken to the Old Science building before 9:30 a. m. Friday. There is no limit to the number of mechanical devices that can be submitted by any size person. Those who bring exhibits will be eligible to compete on a state-wide basis for prizes in the form of bonds for the best labor-saving devices.

At Friday's show there will be motion pictures, talks, a play, and demonstrations. Shows of this type have been held elsewhere in Illinois this winter and have been immensely popular. For example, one thousand people attended the show at Cambridge in the latter town, no less than 20 homemade exhibits of labor-saving devices were exhibited.

The show is expected to be a clearing house for ideas, and now that the farmer is busy by wintering conditions, devices that will help their labor to do more and make the work easier to do should attract considerable attention.

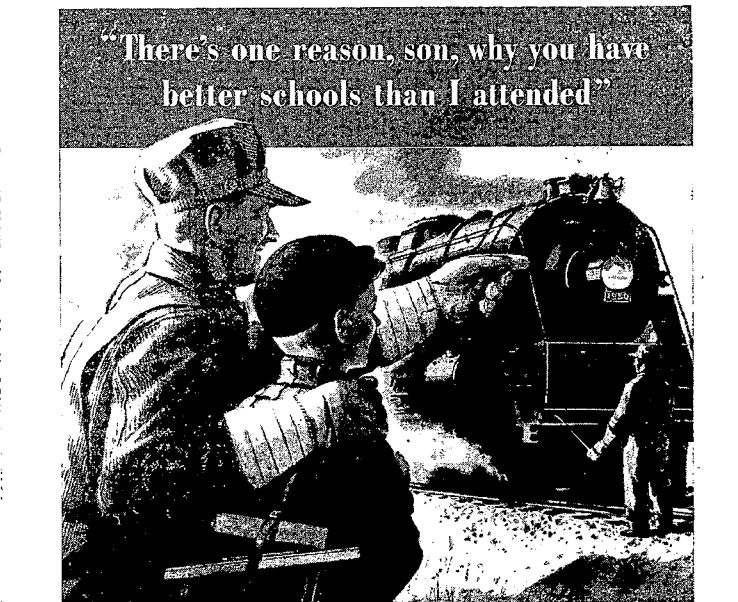
