Formal action by Southern's Board of Trustees last Thursday made approval of the student ac-tivity fee increase for the purpose of raising Student Union funds. a matter of record.

This action completed the first major step toward getting a new Union for Southern students. It was the result of student action, expressed in a campus-wide vote, showing, we believe, that there is genuine student interest and concern in acquiring a new recreational center for the campus.

We wish to commend our Board.

We wish to commend our Board

for formalizing this first step.

Now, many ask, what will be the second step? It seems to use the step of the ste STUDENT ACTION.

We would hasten to warn against quickly - decided - upon means for pushing nearer our goal. On the other hand, we would certainly hate to see this, the project of the whole student body, die, alter only one step forward.

At this point we agree that our present facilities, though they have been admirably provided from the limited materials at hand, are still

inadequate for our needs.

inadequate for our needs.

There is agreement among us that before very long, our school will have outgrown the present facilities and there will be even greater over-crowding of the Student Union than there is now.

There is further agreement that it will not be too long before the present temporary building will have seen better days, despite ef-forts to keep the building in good

repair.

Our problem now is to agree upon some means for taking the next positive step. Outside help will be forthcoming, we believe, but we must first show that we are willing and able to further our own cause. our own cause.

We cannot expect additional help—and we will not receive it —until we have shown beyond question that we want to do some-thing more to meet our own need.


