History of the Higher Education Graduate Program 1956-1995

The Higher Education graduate program of Southern Illinois University has a history that began in the mid-fifties when courses in College Student Personnel were offered by the Department of Guidance and Special Education and courses in community college teaching were offered in the Department of Secondary Education. A formal two-year program in College Student Personnel was refined under the direction of Professor Maude Stewart of the Department of Guidance and Special Education under the encouragement of Dean I. Clark Davis, Director of Student Affairs, who had completed a dissertation entitled an "Analysis of a Graduate Program for College Student Personnel Work Based on Determined Criteria." This dissertation included a survey of such programs being offered by 11 major universities in the Midwest The SIU program, based on many ideas from this dissertation including the importance of the supervised practicum, was approved by the Graduate School and four students were admitted to the program in the fall of 1956. Dr. Stewart resigned in the fall of 1957 to accept a position at The Ohio State University where she initiated a similar graduate program at that institution. Dr. Dennis L. Trueblood who had completed his doctorate at Indiana University came from the National Council of Christians and Jews in January of 1958 to provide leadership for the College Student Personnel program.

Establishment of the Department of Higher Education

During the period leading to January, 1959, plans were put in place to offer graduate programs in Higher Education. Professor Clarence Samford of the Department of Secondary Education, who had been associated with the community college teaching curriculum in the Department of Education, along with visiting professors Parmer Ewing, Harold Benjamin, and Francis Horn, stressed the importance of a more formal program in higher education. Under the encouragement of President Delyte W. Morris, Vice President Charles Tenney, and John E. Grinnell, Dean of the College of Education, a recommendation was prepared for the Board of Trustees for its consideration at its meeting on January 27, 1959, to establish a Department of Higher Education within the College of Education. The Department was formally approved by the Southern Illinois University Board of Trustees with initiation of activity to begin on July 1, 1959. The Department was approved to offer the Ph.D. and the Master of Science in Education degree in Higher Education. The previously approved program in college student personnel was transferred to the new Department of Higher Education. Dr. George Hand, Vice President for Financial Affairs and Professor of Economics, was named the first Chair of the Department. Other original members of the Department were John E. Grinnell, Dennis L. Trueblood, Arthur Lean, and I. Clark Davis. The Department was housed in a former residence on Mill Street on the north edge of the campus that the University had recently acquired. It was moved to the second floor of Wham Education Building in the spring of 1964. Visiting Professor Alonzo Myers of New York University assisted Chairman George Hand and other faculty in constructing the curriculum for both the M.S. in Education Degree and the Ph.D. degree.

One of the first major consultantships of the department was that of assisting McKendree College apply for re-accreditation by the North Central Association. Faculty and doctoral students assisted in this important endeavor which lead to the full accreditation of McKendree Assistance was also provided to Southeast Missouri State University in Cape College. Girardeau. The faculty in cooperation with staff from the Student Affairs Division also assisted in organizing and developing the student affairs program at Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville. In the early days of the Department a number of visiting professors assisted with refining the course offerings and in teaching a number of courses. These individuals included: Harold Benjamin (George Peabody College and University of Maryland), Lloyd Morey (University of Illinois), Harold Riker (University of Florida), Francis Horn (University of Rhode Island), F. G. Macomber (Miami University), James Umstadt (University of Texas), Philip Vairo (Fordham University), Keith Smith (Institutional Research, Southern Illinois University), and Martell Cushman (University of North Dakota). The Department has been fortunate over the vears in being able to invite a number of leaders in the field to serve as speakers and consultants in an effort to augment the course offerings available to students.

The higher education graduate program has had a close working relationship with several student affairs, academic affairs, and fiscal affairs units across the campus and with similar units on the Edwardsville campus of Southern Illinois University. This has provided for a wide range of internship and practicum opportunities for graduate students in support of the goal to provide a sound theoretical base with the opportunity for practical experience and on the job training. The assistance of faculty and staff from these units has been invaluable to the graduate programs in Higher Education. In a similar manner the graduate program has assisted in recruiting highly qualified staff for various offices; many such persons have elected to continue their educational endeavors and have noted that such an opportunity was an important variable in selecting SIU as a place of employment. Internship positions have also been made available at other colleges in Southern Illinois and across the country including McKendree College, McMurray College, Millikin University, John A. Logan College, Southeastern Illinois College, Shawnee Community College, Kaskaskia College, College of DuPage, Southeast Missouri State University, Tulane University, Georgia Tech University, Scott Community College (IA), University of Nebraska, Southern University of Louisiana and other institutions. Summer internship programs have provided students an opportunity to compare procedures and programs at other institutions.

Mission Statement

The following mission statement was established for the Higher Education Graduate Program with minor editorial changes over the years. The mission of the Higher Education Graduate Program is to foster excellence in graduate education for persons involved in or seeking administrative, teaching or research roles in one or more levels of education and related agencies. It is our goal to produce high quality scholarship and research in the area of higher education as a field of study. The faculty of this program have a strong interest in providing opportunities for students to explore the field of higher education. At the master's degree and doctoral levels the faculty assist students to understand basic theories and their applications to teaching and to research and to the administrative practices of a wide variety of careers in two-year and four-year colleges and universities, as well as in agencies associated with higher education. The basic preparation is designed to equip scholars to work effectively in the United States and abroad.

Student Recruitment

From the start of the Higher Education program, the national recruitment program has reached out to students regardless of gender, race, or nationality. I. Clark Davis established a cooperative arrangement with Howard University through Dean Armour Blackburn to recruit its outstanding undergraduates. A significant number of women and minorities have always been included in the program. Their commitment to the field of higher education has been evident in the level of responsibility they have assumed in their professional careers over the years. Several minority students have become college presidents. One is Vice President for Student Affairs at the University of Cincinnati, one is an Emeritus Vice President of Student Affairs at Howard University. Several women hold the position of college president or vice president. Others have headed minority programs at major universities. Two women have served as president of the National Association of Student Personnel Administrators and another alumna has been president of the American College Personnel Association.

A number of international students have been admitted to the program. They have become leaders in higher education around the world including Europe, Asia, Africa, South America, Central America, and Canada. These individuals are serving as college presidents or vice presidents and some are major officers in their Ministry of Education. Even with a smaller enrollment during 1994-1995, 8% of the 142 students in the active files were Black and 5% were international.

Degree Production

Four students completed the M.S. in Education degree with a major in College Student Personnel in 1958 after completing two years of study. After 37 years a total of 1,014 degrees have been awarded for an average of 27 degrees a year. This included 666 master's degrees and 348 Ph.D. degrees in Education with a concentration in Higher Education. At the master's degree level, 416 were in College Student Personnel, 131 in Community College Teaching, and 119 in Organization and Administration.

For the 10 year period from 1981 to 1991, data provided by the Graduate School showed that the higher education program ranked third in the production of Ph.D. degrees following

Educational Administration and Psychology. Yet even with a reduced staff, 99 degrees have been awarded during the immediate past 10 years for an average of almost 10 a year. A total of 111 Ph.D. degrees were earned by women; this is about one-third of the total degrees granted in a field that has only recently opened its doors to women administrators in large numbers. The number of master's degrees has increased during the past 5 years over the 5 preceding years in all programs. A more complete outline may be found on the last page of this publication.

The Department of Higher Education, 1959-1985

The Department of Higher Education grew in the number of faculty and the number of students between 1959 and 1985. With the opening of the Wham Education Building in 1963, the Department was located on the second floor. In 1970 the Department moved to a University leased building, called College View Dorm at 904 West Mill Street. Classes continued to be taught in Wham Education Building. The Department moved back to the Wham Education Building in 1980 where offices were maintained on the third floor. During this period time John E. King served as chair of the Department and under his able leadership from 1971 to 1983, a variety of special projects were completed in addition to the regular teaching and research activities of the faculty. All of the faculty had extensive research and administrative experience that was used effectively to energize the classroom teaching. Several held joint appointments in administrative positions within the University; other faculty who were full-time administrators continued to hold a line appointment in the Department while others served as adjunct professors. Several had extensive experience working in educational settings overseas. All of the faculty participated actively in their relevant professional organizations and frequently held regional or national offices. In the early 1980s a total of nine full-time faculty were members of the department; in addition four administrators held line appointments in the Department as well as four adjunct faculty who assisted in teaching and supervising research.

The basic program at the master's degree level included specialties in College Student Personnel, Academic Affairs, College and University Business Affairs, Adult Education, and Community and Junior College Teaching. The graduation requirements for these various graduate programs were revised during these years under the guidance of the faculty in keeping with student recommendations and guidelines formulated by various relevant professional and academic groups. [These programs are noted in the paragraphs that follow.] Students in these programs held internships where possible All the programs required students to complete a master's thesis or a master's research paper.

The doctoral program in higher education included a common core of courses plus the opportunity for students to develop their own specialties. The preliminary examination covered the core and also the specialty such as academic affairs, business affairs, college teaching, student affairs, institutional research, adult education, and the community college. Students were encouraged to have had some full-time practical experience prior to initiating the doctoral program and students were assisted in developing course programs that included courses from outside the department. Only rarely were students admitted to the doctoral program if they had completed the 72 quarter hour master's degree program in Higher Education. The University adopted the semester system in 1973 and the entire set of courses was revised and graduation

requirements modified; this included a 42 semester hour requirement (later increased to 48) for the CSP program and a 32 semester hour program for the remaining master's degree programs.

Master of Science in Education Degree Programs

The Department offered a master's degree in higher education with several sub-specialties. A brief overview of the developments of these programs is described in the following sections.

College Student Personnel Program. The two-year interdisciplinary College Student Personnel program originally offered in 1957 in the Department of Educational Psychology and Special Education (called the Department of Guidance and Special Education in 1957) was transferred to the new Higher Education Department in 1959 and provided the basic courses for all of the master's degree programs in higher education. The curriculum was revised under the leadership of Dr. Dennis Trueblood . He was assisted by Dr. I. Clark Davis, Director of Student Affairs, who arranged for practicum and internship opportunities for graduate students in the Student Affairs Division. The national search for students entering the program in 1959 was most successful and has been a basis for broad based recruitment ever since. The 72 quarter hour requirement was originally established for the College Student Personnel program when it was still in the Department of Guidance and Special Education and followed the joint efforts of similar master's degree programs in Psychology and Rehabilitation which started at the same time at SIU and which made use of many of the same courses for the three programs.

Dr. Trueblood was the coordinator of the North Central Accreditation review for Southern Illinois University in 1963 and was also named Chair of the Department of Educational Psychology in 1963 while also holding rank in Higher Education. He was elected President of the American College Student Personnel Association for the year of 1963-1964. He died in the winter of 1964 following open heart surgery. This two-year program has continued to the present day under recommendations set by the Council of Organizations in Student Personnel (COSPA). Dr. Donald Robinson who was named the coordinator of the College Student Personnel program in 1965 and Dr. Jack Graham in 1967 were both members of the COSPA committee involved in standards for graduate preparation programs. More recently the Council for the Advancement of Standards (CAS) has outlined guidelines to be followed by preparation programs. The program has remained a two-year program throughout its history with 48 semester hours required in 1995. Dr. Marybelle Keim and Dr. Jack Graham have served as co-editors of the national <u>Directory of Graduate Preparation Programs in College Student Personnel</u> in 1987, 1990, and 1994. They have been able to use their knowledge of the evolvement of national patterns in preparation programs and suggest changes for the SIUC program.

All students in the College Student Personnel program have been required to complete at least 3 hours of practicum and in addition they are required to hold a half-time graduate assistantship sometime during their graduate career; most are so employed throughout their graduate career. Students are encouraged to complete their practical experience in at least three separate offices or service units. Thus students have been able to begin their full-time professional career upon graduation with a minimum of adjustment and special on-the-job training. Students have accepted positions in residence halls, student activities, student development, financial aid, student affairs administration, international student programming, fraternity-sorority advising, placement, student centers and student unions, academic advisement, admissions, intra-murals, student recreation, alumni services, and related areas of responsibility.

Organization and Administration Program. Over the years a smaller number of students have been enrolled in this general one-year program in higher education with an emphasis in general administration in higher education. To indicate opportunities to students with more specific interests sub-specialties were developed in Academic Administration, College and University Business Administration, and Adult Education. These specialties included courses from other Departments throughout the University. In 1983 these specialties were collapsed into a single program called Organization and Administration in Higher Education under the general M.S. in Education Degree in Higher Education. This program was particularly beneficial for University civil service employees who wished to advance themselves in the profession. Admission to this program was discontinued in 1992 by a vote of the faculty in an effort to devote more time and energy to strengthening the other master's degree programs and the doctoral program.

Community College Teaching Program. Under the leadership of Professor Kenneth Brunner in 1966-1967, a more formal program in community college teaching was expanded within the master's degree program. A grant from the Ford Foundation that supported the Community College Cooperative Internship Program in a joint effort with the Junior College District of St. Louis helped to expand this important program and provided many internship opportunities for students. Dr. Donald Tolle was the major adviser to students for this program from 1967 until 1985. He was assisted by Dr. Bruce Swinburne, a former community college dean in Iowa. Dr. Marybelle Keim, who worked with the consortium of community colleges in the larger Kansas City area, later advised students. This program has always included a minimum set of four core courses in higher education plus a minimum of 20 credit hours in the department of the subject area in which the student planned to teach. The required research paper (or thesis) for this program was normally on a topic from the student's teaching specialty area; the advisers from the department with the help of the adviser from higher education guided the progress of this research. An internship in a community college has always been recommended and in recent years this has been a requirement. This program has been helpful for students who wished to learn more about the community college setting, recommended procedures in teaching, and the total academic community in addition to their subject matter area.

Doctor of Philosophy Degree in Education with a Concentration in Higher Education

Courses were added to the curriculum to provide graduate opportunities for doctoral students. The first student to complete the doctoral program in higher education was Herbert W. Wohlwend in 1964. The doctoral program in Higher Education became a part of the Ph.D. degree in Education with a concentration in Higher Education in 1964 as a result of a North Central Review of all the doctoral programs offered by departments in the College of Education. It followed the regulations outlined by the graduate faculty of the College of Education regarding the minimum number of hours (64) for the plan of study, the selection of the dissertation committee, completion of research tool requirements, completion of the preliminary examination,

advancement to candidacy, submission of a prospectus, and the completion of a dissertation. Doctoral research covered a wide range of topics an utilized various research designs.

Undergraduate Courses

As early as 1952 a special undergraduate course was designed to assist in the preparation of Resident Fellows (currently called Student Resident Assistants or RAs) who worked in the Residence Hall program of the University; by Board Policy highly qualified seniors and Graduate Students were selected for these positions. This variable credit course was first offered through the Department of Guidance and Special Education. In 1959 it was transferred to the Department of Higher Education. In more recent years it has had the course number of EAHE 402 with the title of: Principles of Student Personnel Group Work. In addition to Resident Assistants, special sections have been offered for the benefit of fraternity and sorority officers, housing officers, student attendants for handicapped students, cultural exchange program participants for American and International Students; student government officers, and new student orientation leaders. This course has been most useful in helping a wide range of student leaders improve their ability to work with groups of students and in developing their leadership skills. Professor Jack W. Graham gave leadership in coordinating the activities of this varied seminar.

A special seminar was offered in the early 1970s for members of student government to assist them gain a broader concept of the history, organizational structure, and impact of higher education on society. This followed a recommendation of the University faculty who sought ways to interact with student leaders during the turbulent years of this period of time.

Research and Scholarly Activities

The faculty have been directly involved in a number of grants and in completing a wide range of research projects and scholarly publications. The Department published under the editorship of Dr. Donald Tolle <u>Selected Bibliography in Higher Education</u>, a bibliography of books, journals, and dissertations by SIU higher education students that were available from the Southern Illinois University Morris Library. Editions of this bibliography were published in 1978, 1983, and 1985. In 1983 the Department published, <u>The Scholarly and Creative Endeavors of the</u> <u>Department of Higher Education</u>. It contains over 700 entries. Faculty have continued to publish journal articles, monographs, and books related to the field of higher education.

Professor Michael Dingerson headed the Office of Research Development and Administration for Southern Illinois University at Carbondale for many years and also taught research courses and directed research in the Department. Professor I. Clark Davis was editor of the <u>Peronnel-O-Gram</u> (predecessor to the <u>Journal of College Student Development</u> of ACPA) in the late 1950s. Professor Jack Graham was also Associate Dean of the Graduate School from 1974 to 1979; he was also on the editorial board of <u>International Education</u>. Dr. Emil Spees served on the Publications Board of the American College Student Personnel Association for several years. Dr. Marybelle Keim was honored for her scholarly activity by the National Council on Community Services and Continuing Education of the American Association of Community College; she also serves on the editorial board of the <u>Community College Review</u>. Both Professor John E. King and Professor Roland Keene received recognition for their scholarly activity through a number of grants from which several books were published. Professor Oliver Caldwell was the author of several books and prior to coming to the Department served in the U.S. Department of Education as Assistant Commissioner of Education. Faculty members have presented scholarly papers at a large number of national professional meetings.

Dr. Margaret Barr (M.Ed., College Student Personnel, 1964) has been honored by the American College Personnel Association and the National Association of Student Personnel Association for her continued research and scholarly activity in the field of higher education. She is the author and editor of a large number of books and monographs and became Vice President for Student Affairs at Northwestern University in 1992. Dr. Manual Justiz (Ph.D., 1977) was Director of the National Institute of Education, the research arm of the U.S. Department of Education from 1981-1983; he later became Dean of the College of Education at the University of Texas--Austin. Dr. Abdulla Al-Gheithi (Ph.D. 1991) was honored by the Graduate School that granted him the Dissertation of the Year Award in June, 1992, for his research in 1991. This award and the accompanying check were presented to him by the United States Ambassador to Yemen in 1992 where Dr. Al-Gheithi had returned to his home country as a member of the faculty of Educational Administration at Sanaa University. He was named chair of this faculty in 1995. Dr. Thanu Kulachol (Ph.D., 1977) has supported research as President of Bangkok University and has continued his scholarly activity including being President of the Thailand Chapter of Phi Delta Kappa. Thomas Hadley (Ph.D., 1985) holds the position of Vice Provost for Research & Program Development at the University of Cincinnati. Michael Dingerson (Ph.D., 1974) serves as Associate Vice Chancellor for Research and Dean of the Graduate School at the University of Mississippi. David Gulley (Ph.D., 1989) is an assistant to the Vice President for Research at the University of Illinois--Chicago. Twanjit Jitaree (Ph.D., 1991) travels extensively in Southeast Asia as a leading researcher in the Ministry of Education of Thailand. These are but a few of the alumni who have continued to be very active in research and scholarly activities.

Graduate Assistantships, Internships and Practicum Activities

All students in the two-year College Student Personnel master's degree program are required to hold some type of graduate assistantship or part-time or full-time employment while enrolled in the program to gain sufficient practical experience to be effective in their first full-time employment position upon graduation. In addition, they are required to enroll for a practical experience in a practicum or internship position in an office different from where they are employed. Units providing graduate assistantships included: Office of the Vice President for Student Affairs, Office of Student Development, University Housing, Student Health Service, Student Center, Student Financial Aid, Intramural-Recreational Sports, University Career Services, Upward Bound Project, University Studies, Women's Studies, International Programs and Services, College Academic Advisement Centers, Alumni Services, Budget Office, Center for Basic Skills, SIU Foundation, Institutional Research, International and Economic Development, and Research Development and Administration. This broad range of offices and services has been a positive recruiting factor for students. All students in the Community College Teaching program are also expected to complete some type of work experience preferably in a classroom or laboratory teaching setting. This can be done at one of the neighboring community colleges.

Most doctoral students hold some type of graduate assistantship related to their professional field or in a research setting such as Institutional Research and Studies or Student Affairs. Many work full-time in some unit of SIUC or in a nearby community college or university. In the 1960s several administrative offices reserved internship positions for doctoral student enrolled in Higher Education; this included the Office of the President and offices of the various vice presidents as well as offices of selected academic deans.

It should also be noted that because so many of the graduate students enrolled in this Department carry part-time or full-time appointments at SIUC or in colleges or universities in the greater Carbondale area, they often take a part-time academic load or may not be enrolled in a given semester or summer session.

The Post-Doctoral Academy of Higher Education

At the suggestion of doctoral students in 1973 the structure of an organization for graduate alumni, current graduate students, and faculty in higher education was organized in the winter of 1974. The annual meetings of this organization provided an opportunity for national leaders in the field of higher education to make a keynote address. This was followed by a series of papers presented by alumni, faculty, and current graduate students; this provided an excellent opportunity for graduate students to gain self confidence in presenting papers at regional and national conventions. The organization has honored a number of administrators and faculty from units outside the Department and has provided special honors for national scholars in the field of higher education. Summaries of the research and scholarly activities were published for many years in the organization's research publication, <u>The Tertium Quid</u>. The officers and those receiving special recognition from the Post Doctoral Academy are listed on page 16.

The Post Doctoral Academy has provided alumni with a newsletter, published at least annually. It has honored several individuals who have made a significant contribution to higher education through its awards program and the selection of Collegial Fellows. It has placed in Morris Library a book in memory of all students, alumni, and faculty who have died over the years. It has assisted in student recruitment and in the placement of graduates. It is nearing the completion of a drive to secure funds to establish a scholarship for graduate students in Higher Education through the SIU Foundation.

For several summers in the mid-seventies a special week-end seminar was held for the benefit of current students, alumni, current faculty, and emeritus faculty. Professor John Hawley coordinated the activities of the seminar, which was held at the Ramada Inn and then at the Touch of Nature. Later this was combined with the activities of the Post Doctoral Academy.

Placement and Promotions

All students who wished to begin work in a college or university or related agency have been placed in an initial position in keeping with their graduate study. These positions for master's degree and doctoral graduates have included administrative, teaching, research, and service positions. Graduates have continued to stay in the field of higher education over the years (near 85%) and have given evidence of their ability to be promoted, to conduct research, and to provide service on their campuses and in national professional organizations. Graduates hold positions in all ranks of teaching and a wide range of administrative positions including those of President, Vice President, Dean, Director, Chair, and Coordinator. They hold positions in large universities (i.e., University of Illinois, Northwestern University, and University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, University of California at Los Angeles, Texas A&M, Lehigh University, Morehead State University), liberal arts colleges (i.e., Linville College [OR], Parks College of St. Louis University, Mercyhurst College, Greenville College, and Cornell College), and community colleges (i.e., Dade County Community College [FL], John A. Logan College, Southeastern Illinois College, Shawnee Community College). They have filled positions across the United States and in many foreign countries. Over thirty of the alumni have served (now retired) or are serving as presidents or chancellors of colleges and universities.

Department of Educational Administration and Higher Education, 1985 to 1995

In July, 1985, the Department of Higher Education and the Department of Educational Leadership were merged to form a single department entitled the Department of Educational Administration and Higher Education. The graduate programs in Educational Administration and in Higher Education were maintained as approved programs offered through the Graduate School. This merger took place at a time when there was a shortage of funds and extreme pressure came from the Illinois Board of Higher Education to consolidate the organizational structure of the University where possible. William Eaton was named chair of this new department by Donald L. Beggs, Dean of the College of Education.

Between 1959 and 1995 the graduate programs were reviewed three times through the internal review process conducted by the Graduate School with outside consultants. These reviews were all positive and steps were taken to modify and improve the programs in keeping with specific recommendations. The Department was recognized in various national reviews and studies as being a typical example of a broad based graduate program in the area of higher education. The most recent commendation came in the book by Linda M. Clement and Scott Rickard, Effective Leadership in Student Services published in 1992.

The course requirements in Higher Education continued with minor variations until the beginning of the 1993-1994 academic year when admissions were suspended to the sub-specialty in Organization and Administration for the master's degree program in Higher Education. The remaining sub-specialties of College Student Personnel and Community College Teaching continued with increased enrollments. The concentration in Higher Education of the Ph.D. degree program in Education was suspended by the Board of Trustees at its meeting in August, 1993, despite strong objections raised by current students, former students, and the faculty. This action

followed a statewide review of undergraduate and graduate programs by the Illinois Board of Higher Education in its effort to assure quality in productivity of higher education and to reduce the number of duplicate programs. Action baken by the Board of Trustees was based on recommendations coming from the Graduate Council. Students currently enrolled in the programs discontinued in higher education at SIUC were permitted to complete their degrees. New doctoral applicants who qualified and had an interest in higher education administration were admitted to the doctoral concentration in Educational Administration.

The Department moved to the first floor of Pulliam Hall in 1993. This provided additional office space for the faculty and provided a much larger conference room. The Department Resource Room became a meeting place for graduate students. Additional computers were made available along and a graduate assistant was added to the staff to provide technical assistance in completing various research studies.

All faculty members of the Department of Educational Administration and Higher Education taught courses open to higher education students and assisted in the supervision of research reports, theses, and dissertations. Adjunct faculty from the Student Affairs Division assisted in teaching selected courses and in suspervising interns.


