REGISTRATION PROCEDURE

All new students and others who have not previously been assigned to counselors will report first to the Dean of Men or the Dean of Women for assignment to individual counselors. These counselors will advise them in their selection of courses and approve the schedules when finally arranged. The tuition bills are also made out and paid at the same time.

All students will go to the Men's Gymnasium to register.

A student may not go above or below these classifications more than one year.

THE NORMAL LOAD for a student is 10 to 12 credit hours. Any load above 12 credit hours regularly requires a 4.25 average and the approval of the Dean of the College concerned; or in the case of graduate students the approval of the Chairman of the Graduate Studies Committee. Students ON PROBATION are to inform their counselor of that fact. Their load is limited to 10 credit hours.

CHANGES in the student's program AFTER registration day can be made only by the use of a PROGRAM CHANGE CARD obtained from the Academic Dean.

DROPPING OUT OF SCHOOL requires a PROGRAM CHANGE CARD obtained from the appropriate Student Life Dean.
